<u>Illness</u>

We have been informed of one case of scarlet fever at nursery. 'Scarlet fever is an infection that causes a blotchy, pink-red rash. It's most common in young children, but can affect people of any age.

It isn't usually serious and can be treated with antibiotics from your GP. Once you've had it, you're unlikely to get it again.

Symptoms of scarlet fever develop within a week of being infected.

Early signs include a <u>sore throat</u>, a <u>headache</u>, a high temperature (38.3C/101F or above), <u>swollen glands</u> in the neck and being sick.

This may be followed by a rash on the body, a red face and a white or red tongue.

You are advised to see your GP if your child has any symptoms.
