This Week

This week the children have been learning about wild animals. They have been reading and performing the rhyme 'Walking Through the Jungle'. They have also learnt the song 'Walking Through the Jungle'. The children have been tearing and cutting paper to make camouflage hats. They have also made binoculars in forest school.

The children have been making animal patterns using paint and different utensils to create the different patterns. E.g. stripes, spots etc. They have been comparing sizes to put different sized animals in the correct boxes.

Outside the children have been exploring mixing flour and water to make 'milk' for the animals. They have labelled bottles and filled them using different sized funnels, spoons etc. We have also been learning to use whisks to create bubbles. The children have been talking about what happens to the flour and water and what changes take place. Children have been developing and using cutting skills, cutting grass and plants. They have been using large paper and corks to print to make animal spotted patterns to use in the role play area.

Following children's interests: the children enjoyed rolling the large cable reels down the path and discussing which went the furthest and using ordinal numbers to compare. E.g 1^{st} , 2^{nd} , 3^{rd} . The children have been singing and performing to 'Let it $6^{o'}$ in the music area. Some children also enjoyed wrapping different sized and shaped boxes to make presents for a birthday party.
